Santa Rosa City Schools Parent,

Although the District is required to notify parents of their rights under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 as outlined below, there are no Santa Rosa City Schools that are deemed to be persistently dangerous schools, as defined by this federal law.

Section 9532 of the No Child Left Behind Act provides that **a student that is a victim of a criminal offense, as defined in the California State Penal Code, while in school or on school grounds**, may request a transfer to another elementary or secondary school within the District. Examples of such offenses include but are not limited to: attempted murder, battery with serious bodily injury, assault with a deadly weapon, rape, sexual battery, robbery, extortion, and hate crimes.

If you believe your child has been a victim of a violent crime, as defined in bold above, and believe transferring schools is in your child's best interest, please contact your child's school administrator.
